Yet we can also see more clearly now the work that is ours to do, and want to celebrate with you the good that has come.

We are humbled that in the midst of a global pandemic, many of our circles became a safe space for people to land. We pivoted quickly to a virtual format while remaining true to our values. With so much grief and change to process, our circles became places of refuge, hope, and community.

This report contains a snapshot of a few things that have been happening at 40 Orchards, and how we've felt God with us. None of this could have happened without the support, participation, and spirit of the 40 Orchards community. We are so grateful for you.

Some things that have been happening...



WE EXPANDED OUR REACH.

Virtual circles took our community beyond Minnesota. We now have participants from California, Nevada, Colorado, Michigan, and even Germany!



WE ENGAGED IN RACIAL JUSTICE.

We responded to the murder of George Floyd and the rising calls for racial justice first by opening studies on justice in summer 2020, and then by launching a new Perspectives program in October. Through Perspectives we have centered and learned from traditionally marginalized BIPOC voices. These sessions have been rich, both for our community and new attenders.



WE CONNECTED TO RHYTHMS.

In a time when days blurred, we helped people engage thoughtfully with the seasonal rhythms, adding Advent and Lenten Scripture Circles, and moving our Seder Experience to a virtual event. Many new people connected through these experiences.



WE CONTINUED THE COHORT.

Cohort Dalet had a closing retreat day in July 2020 that was a deeply moving experience of God's presence and community. In January 2021, Cohort Hey began. Even though in the midst of the pandemic, we are going strong with 10 members.



WE LED COMMUNALLY.

Our commitment to the communal voice is both about what we do and how we do it. We don't believe leadership needs to take the form of a solo and lonely guru. In that spirit, Stephanie and Lisa moved into a co-leadership model, and we added Sarah Nichols as a new teacher. We look forward to adding more teachers and board members in the future.



WE MOURNED THE LOSS OF HUGS.

Though the pivot to virtual circles went well, it is not the same as in-person. We are proud of how we worked to honor CDC guidelines and protect the vulnerable among us. But we grieved with you the loss of connection. Some have struggled to participate, or have even dropped out, during this time of virtual gatherings.



WE DEEPENED OUR ROOTS.

In fall of 2020, we launched a new Roots program, growing our offerings to three: Torah. Gospels, and Prophets. Prophets was so popular that we offered and filled a second session in spring of 2021.



WE STAYED IN THE BLACK.

In a time when many organizations struggled, we continued to have people attend our programs, our generous donors continued to support us, and we never missed a payroll.



WE WRESTLED WITH HARD THINGS.

We struggled to fill some studies and programs, and had to cancel a few, not knowing whether topic, timing, or fatigue was the cause. We were frustrated by the continued lack of racial, ethnic, and gender diversity in our circles. We still hope to teach in the prisons, and continue in the slow way forward. We know wrestling like this is an essential part of leadership and the human journey.

3 STRONG PARTNERSHIPS

The pandemic led to the loss of a few partnerships, but we continued to teach with Awaken Community, Bethel University, and Colonial Church. We hope to add more partners in the future.

84 SCRIPTURE CIRCLES

Putting together partnerships,
Roots, Perspectives, one-time,
and seasonal offerings (but not
including the Cohort), we held
about 84 Scripture Circles this
year! Those circles include many
who have gone through some
kind of faith deconstruction and
are feeling lost. We provide a
safe space for their questions
and exploration of a more
expansive way to hold Scripture.

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NEW PERSPECTIVES GATHERINGS

We learned from Joe Davis, Jia Starr Brown, Kelly Sherman-Conroy, and Kiah Glenn. Each listening session brought 15-30 people, honoring our culture of intimacy while also expanding bigger than our circles. Several new people came, and many attended multiple sessions.

14 PEOPLE PER CIRCLE

We cap every Scripture Circle to an attendance of 14. This is an expression of our values of seeing each other and wrestling together. We want every voice to be heard. This summer, we opened bonus circles for Potentially Dangerous Questions, in order to accommodate the many who wanted to attend.

PROOTS PROGRAMS

Each year, we have expanded our Roots program. We offered Torah in both a 10-month, and new this summer, weekly, format. We offered Prophets in a twice-a-month followed by 10-month format. We also offered Gospels monthly. All told, about 50 people joined Roots, about 25% new to the program.

ZO HOUSEHOLDS SERVED

Our Seder experience virtually joined 28 households together to eat symbolic food, look for God, and ask each other questions about what it means to leave the Narrow Place. This brought a mix of people who were new to, returning to, and rediscovering 40 Orchards.

We believe each person has unique gifts they're meant to bring to the world—gifts that rest within them like seeds waiting to burst forth.

Rooting deeply.

We believe there are threads connecting passages into the larger story of God and humanity—and that language and history can help us unlock layers of meaning, beyond the surface level.

Wrestling together.

We are committed to creating spaces that are safe for each of us to come as we are, with all our doubts and fears. We teach not through lecture, but in dialogue.

Expecting more.

We believe it's not incidental that the original dwelling place on earth—where humans and God walked side by side—was named Eden, or "delight". We look to the future through the lens of sacred possibility.
